What is a web application?

It's an application that runs on a server instead of a desktop or laptop.

Web servers use their own set of software. Instead of a graphical interface, they present web pages and services. Here are some examples of software that runs on web servers.











Web application overview



Who manages this?

- You can go to wordpress.org, download the software and manage it all yourself (full-on geek)
- You can pay someone to manage it for you (hire a contractor / web developer)
- You can pay for hosting and manage only the non-geek stuff


Apples and Oranges



- wordpress.org is where they develop and maintain the WordPress software. You can download it and do what you want with it.
- wordpress.com is a hosting service. They manage the LAMP server and the WordPress application.


The real question about WordPress does not concern .com or .org. It's about where you will host it.

What is hosting?



Traditionally, web hosting was just a server connected to the Internet.

But over the years, many things caused it to become more complicated. Security threats, higher use and web applications brought about a more complicated picture.








Custom Domain










- Owned and operated by the same parent company

- → Slow page loads
- → Poor support (which only matters if you need it)
- → Still a viable option?
 - → Low traffic sites
 - → Lowest price / best deal
 - → Happy with essentials



Which way to go



 Are you a geek? Perhaps a VPS or shared hosting is the way to go.



 Non-geeky writer? A fully managed plan is best. Either pay someone to manage your shared hosting or use one of the plans at wordpress.com or DreamPress.

Backups

 You can download all of your pages and posts from within wordpress.

You can download all of your

media.

 Most hosting companies offer some form of automatic backup.

Key questions to ask yourself

- Do you want a custom domain? e.g. www.yourname.com or are you happy with yourname.wordpress.com?
- Do you care about ads? They don't hurt anything until they do.
- How much traffic do you expect?

Bottom line is there is no such thing as free. You will pay for it one way or another. Whether through ads, unprofessional domain names or other little things to damage your brand, you will pay for your hosting.

PROS

- → Get exactly the look you want
- → Place things on the page anywhere you like
- → Add functionality



CONS

- → Maintenance is yourMetro responsibility
 - → Security is your responsibility
 - → You will have to check the theme/plugin for compatibility each time there is a wordpress update.
 - → Occasionally, things break. You need a plan for handling this on custom themes/plugins.

Pre-built themes and plugins are maintained by someone else and used by many people. They are customizable so they won't look exactly the same on every site. If you choose a good one, it upgrades along with WordPress.
